	The reported issues will be assessed to determine their severity and impact on the organisation
	Decision
	If deemed necessary, a recommendation for cancellation will be made to the Board President, who will make the final decision. Legal advice should be sought as required.
	Notification
	If cancellation is approved, formal notification will be provided to the other party, outlining the reasons and any necessary steps for termination.
	Documentation
	All decisions, communications, and justifications will be documented for record-keeping and compliance purposes.
