Policy	This policy aims to integrate a philosophy of sustainable development into all the organisation's activities and to establish and promote sound environmental practice in our operations. CCDR commits itself to minimising its impact on our environment and animals through:

No harm to animals

Single use plastics and non-recyclable disposable items

Single use plastics should not be used in any of the CCDR offices. Keep cups are provided to staff so that take-away coffee cups can be avoided.

At events and meetings, vendors should also be instructed that single use plastics should not be used and non-recyclable disposable items should be avoided. Where paper napkins are used, we should aim to use recyclable products (even if CCDR needs to source these) and a staff member needs to be responsible for ensuring that these are then place in a recycling bin at events. At small functions (less than 50 people), CCDR may be able provide cloth napkins that can be washed and re-used.

Paper restrictions

There is very little need for printing at CCDR. All files are kept in electronic form and staff should be conscious of the amount of paper they are using for printing and reflect on whether it is absolutely necessary to print a document. Documents that do need to be printed for example are:

- Contracts and other legal documents that require an original signature
- Non-paper invoices
- Standard Operating Procedures

Landfill and energy reduction

All staff will use reasonable endeavors:

- To reuse and recycle materials, purchase recycled materials, and use recyclable packaging and other materials.
- To minimise materials and energy use, prevent air, water, and other pollution, and dispose of waste safely and responsibly.
- To conserve energy by improving energy efficiency and giving preference to renewable over non-renewable energy sources when feasible.
- To utilise its particular knowledge and experience to contribute to environmentally sustainable techniques, technology, knowledge and methods.

No harm to animals

All CCDR events, team events and meetings with catering will be meat-free (i.e. vegetarian).

Policy Implementation and assignment of responsibility

All staff, volunteers and Board members are responsible for adhering to this policy
