Purpose	The purpose of this document is to provide a framework for interactions between Centre for Community-Driven Research (CCDR) and the International Centre for Community-Driven Research (ICCDR). As a very small entity, the policies and processes in place need to be fit for purpose.
Policy	<p>CCDR and ICCDR are separate legal entities and shall operate as such under separate governance boards/committees</p> <p>The functional role of Chief Executive for CCDR will be voluntary</p> <p>The role of Chief Executive for ICCDR will be a mix of voluntary and paid work where funding is available</p> <p>While there is this legal and accounting separation, the Chief Executive for both entities shall be the same individual. It is accepted that work will be implemented as per deliverables agreed in any grants received, without alteration.</p> <p>Funds received to CCDR will only be used for work within Australia, however CCDR may provide funds to ICCDR to deliver the work for any projects for the Australian population. CCDR will not provide funding to ICCDR for international work.</p> <p>An internal record to assure that expenditure of funds is only used for the assigned project, will be maintained.</p> <p>Funds received to ICCDR from other sources will be used for any work within its international remit.</p>
Policy Implementation and assignment of responsibility	All staff, volunteers and Board members are responsible for adhering to this policy.
