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The inaugural program of work for the world federation for primary care and community nursing requires prioritising initiatives that align with global healthcare challenges, emphasising education, advocacy, collaboration, and systems strengthening. Below is a draft program of work to be discussed and endorsed by the inaugural executive committee and is dependent on funding.

Quarter 1: Foundation and Stakeholder Engagement

Objective: Establish secretariat infrastructure and build stakeholder networks

1. Secretariat Setup

- Finalise the federation's governance structure (board, committees, and working groups)
- Launch initial communication channels (website, newsletter, and social media presence)

2. Stakeholder Mapping

- Identify and map stakeholders, including national nursing associations, healthcare organisations, academic institutions, and policymakers

3. Key Partnerships

- Establish partnerships with relevant global health organisations
- Engage government bodies

4. Strategic Planning:

- Commence development of the inaugural program of work, outlining priority areas

Quarter 2: Capacity Building and Advocacy

Objective: Strengthen capacity for primary care nursing and advocate for its role in global health

1. Capacity-Building Initiatives

- Identify existing learning opportunities and any gaps that could be developed as modules on primary care nursing leadership, cultural competence, and evidence-based practice.

2. Advocacy Campaigns

- Identify existing advocacy campaigns and opportunities for alignment
- Advocate at international forums (e.g., World Health Assembly) for increased investment in primary care nursing

4. Community Engagement and Regional Representation

- Document a plan to ensure engagement and equity of access for membership and members across regions

Quarter 3: Research and Innovation

Objective: Foster a global evidence base for primary care nursing practices

1. Global Research Agenda

- Draft a global research agenda for primary care and community nursing

2. Data Collection and Benchmarking:

- Begin designing data collection on workforce demographics, education levels, and nursing practice standards in primary care
- Design a benchmarking report on the state of community nursing globally

Quarter 4: Evaluation and Global Summit

Objective: Set the stage for continued growth

1. Evaluation of Progress:

- Develop a forward plan for monitoring and evaluation

2. Global Primary Care Nursing Summit:

- Develop the first global summit to share best practices, discuss challenges, and showcase innovative projects
- Present awards for outstanding contributions to primary care nursing

3. Policy Recommendations:

- Invite contributions for a peer reviewed series, with policy recommendations, for strengthening primary care and community nursing worldwide

4. Looking Ahead:

- Refine the next year's work plan based on lessons learned
- Expand membership and deepen partnerships with regional and international health organisations.
